The Hugh Caulkins Scholarship in Meteorology

The Hugh Caulkins Scholarship in Meteorology will recognize outstanding undergraduate students preparing for careers in Meteorology.

Guidelines

- A. This scholarship is restricted to students who plan to pursue a career in meteorology. Applicants must register, both in the Spring Semester, when the application is made, and the following Fall Semester when the scholarship is awarded.
- B. To apply, students must have completed or be currently enrolled in MTH 133, PHY 145, PHY 175, and ESC 304 and have a signed major in meteorology.
- C. Students must have a minimum GPA of 3.5 in their required meteorology, mathematics, and physics courses and a 3.25 GPA overall.
- D. Students receiving this scholarship are ineligible for the Charles Warren and Denzil Slentz Thornhwaite Fund
- E. An application must include:
 - 1. A cover letter-which must include the applicant's major, all minors, social security number, year in school, permanent and local address, and phone number.
 - 2. A description of your career objectives.
 - 3. A current copy of the applicant's transcripts and a list of courses in which he/she is currently enrolled.
 - 4. A list of core courses taken and grades received.

*All applications must be received by the Geography Department secretary on or before March 20.

*Award notification will normally be made by April 15. Up to two awards will be given annually. An interview may be requested of all applicants.

*Students receiving the Hugh Caulkins Scholarship may reapply in subsequent years.

*Half of the Hugh Caulkins Scholarship will be awarded in the fall. To receive the Spring allotment, recipients must maintain their grade point average and not change their major.

*If the Geography Department determines there are no qualified applicants, the Office of Scholarship and Financial Aid will be notified by May 1 so students demonstrating financial need and maintaining a 3.0 grade point average in other degree programs may be considered.

*Students receiving the Charles Warren and Denzil Slentz Thornthwaite Memorial Scholarship may reapply in subsequent years.
